Folks,

It is indeed an honor to have been selected by you to serve as the 40th President of the United States JCI Senate.

First Things First: If you missed Lisle (Chicago) you missed an outstanding National Convention. Chairs Wayne Kiefer and Tony Symoniak organized a great adventure and meeting starting with a "Picnic in the Park" where the USJCI Senate hosted an informal dinner in the park with approximately 300 Jaycees. The interaction with the Jaycees by approximately 100 Senators will hopefully pay good dividends for both organizations. Then it was off to the "ole" ballpark where the home team Chicago White Sox beat the visiting Oakland Athletics.

Then it was the business portion of the Convention. Cleveland, Ohio was selected to be the host of the 2013 National Convention. The By-Law Amendment to expand the time to submit a bid to host a National Board Meeting was passed, while the By-Law Amendment to allow non-affiliated senators (senators from states without a state senate organization) to become members of the US JCI Senate was defeated. Thanks Wayne, Tony, and all the people who worked to make this a great convention.

A US JCI Senate thanks to all the Senators who served as Program Managers, Chairs, and Committee Members this past year.

Now to the 2011-2012 Year: The theme for this year is "Where the Stars and Stripes and the Eagle Fly," the wording borrowed from an old Aaron Tippin song.

Of course, the Stars and Stripes refer to the width, breadth, and magnitude of this Country, as well as the folks and Senators who comprise it.

The Logo has four stars on each side - the stars representing (1) our Veterans, (2) our Foundation, (3) our Jaycees, and (4) our Senate. To that end, we will continue to honor our Country and Veterans with a special recognition at each meeting upon the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag. Remember, we are the Land of the Free, because of the Brave!

We will place special emphasis on our Foundation - The United States JCI Senate Foundation - by focusing this year on only our Foundation, which provides scholarships for high school seniors - our future leaders, Jaycees, and ultimately Senators. We will continue to honor Foundation Award recipients at our evening meal

at our meetings. In addition, the Foundation President and his Wife as well as Past Presidents of the Foundation will be recognized, if in attendance at the Board Meetings. All new members to the Foundation as well as those that reach a new level of giving, if in attendance, will be recognized by receiving a special "Where the Stars and Stripes and the Eagle Fly" pin.

We will continue to work closely with the Jaycees mentoring, training, and in membership. Our RTF (Return The Favor) Program will be expanded to recognize five (5) Senators at each of our meetings and if they are in attendance, they too will receive a special "Where the Stars and Stripes and the Eagle Fly" pin - this pin being different from the one mentioned above.

But most important, our Senators. The last two years we have seen a drop in our organization's membership. It seems that we "are dying faster than we can replenish ourselves." To that end, we will be stressing the following programs:

A) Jaycee Education as to the honor of awarding Senatorships to their outstanding Jaycees. This must include a very positive outlook by Senators towards their Jaycees. If we persist in our criticisms or "how it used to be", why would anyone want to spend the money to honor a Jaycee to become a Senator? Remember we are here because at one time the Jaycees were our love and life. Let us continue to make that happen with the Jaycees today. The Jaycee Creed is the same today, as it was when you and I joined the Jaycees, and the same as when Bill Brownfield wrote it! Let us be positive and helpful with our Jaycees.

We have requested Kim Bode #62467, Chair of Future Directions, to develop a policy for us to match funds with SOMs to be able to recognize and welcome into our fellowship these individuals.

In the coming year, I will be selecting my travel where I hope there can have some interaction with Jaycees because without Jaycees we would soon be without a Senate.

I look forward to the 2011-2012 year with eagerness and excitement and I hope that the NVPs John M., Regina, Ariel, Debra, Owen, John D., Ronnie, Jack, Pete, and CJ are as eager and excited as I am.

I would be remiss if I did not thank my fellow Senators in Florida, Region IV, Region VII, and all my friends who stood by me, encouraged me, and helped me to reach this plateau of serving you folks as US JCI Senate President. 

state, since so much of our senate activities revolve around these activities. The sheer complexity and variety of these laws render it impossible for any one person to be adequately familiar with all of them such as to be able to render a reliable opinion. And President Steve won't let me hire the twenty member staff it would require to handle this myself.

Consequently, I encourage each State to have a state legal counsel on staff. If you already have one on staff, that's swell. If you don't have one, find a lawyer within your membership and appoint him or her. If you can't find one within your current membership, then look outside to non-member senators and use this as a tool to recruit and activate. What can it cost you? Perhaps a name badge at most.

As this new senate year is commencing, this is a good time for your senate and its legal counsel to take stock of your senate's legal situation. Is your corporate status in place? Some states require a special filing with the secretary of state at least once every five years to maintain a corporate charter. Does your state so require and is your senate in compliance? Does your state require registration for charitable fund raising and, if so, are you in compliance? Are your forms and filings up to date? Has your senate filed the informational or actual tax returns required by the IRS? Is your liability insurance in place? All interesting questions, I know, and worthy of a little of your time. However, they are important to the life and survival of your senate organization. A state legal counsel will find them fascinating and it's a good way to keep him or her occupied.

So, in spite of the Shakespearian directive, a lawyer can be your friend. So, get one on staff, get to know him or her. Hug him; pamper her, whatever it takes. Remember, in spite of all scientific evidence to the contrary, lawyers need love, too.

"The first thing we do, let's kill all the lawyers." (Henry the 6th, Part 2, Act 4, Scene 2)

In spite of this admonition from Shakespeare, I am looking forward to serving as your Legal Counsel for this 2011 – 2012 year. My role as the legal counsel of the U.S. Senate is to serve as the legal advisor to the President, the Board of Directors and to the organization. As such, my primary responsibilities are to the Senate as a whole. This means that I cannot give individual legal advice to you as a state officer or to your state. However, I am always available to answer questions of a general nature and provide information that can point you in the right direction. Feel free to call or email me.

One of the reasons for this limitation on my duties, in addition to obvious conflict of interest problems, is the laws and regulations under which each individual state senate must operate. Each state has its own laws pertaining to alcohol sales. Each state has its own regulations about charitable solicitations and raffles. And your senate needs to be aware of the laws and regulations in your


we can do a repeat this coming year.



HISTORIAN

As we head to Ft. Worth, TX for our Fall BOD meeting, this city's history is one typical Wild West story. The city was named after Major General William Jenkins Worth (1794–1849) who served as second in command to General Zachary Taylor at the opening of the Mexican-American War in 1846. After the war, Worth was placed in command of the Department of Texas in 1849. Before Worth could complete his mission, he died of cholera in February, 1849. His replacement, General William S. Harney took over and ordered Major Ripley A. Arnold to find a new fort site near the West Fork and Clear Fork. On June 6, 1849, Arnold established a camp on the bank of the Trinity River and named the post Camp Worth in honor of the late General Worth.

The famous Chisholm Trail evolved Fort Worth from a sleepy outpost to a bustling town because it was the stop on the dusty path on which millions of head of cattle were driven North to market. Fort Worth became the center of the cattle drives, and later, the ranching industry. Its location on the Old Chisholm Trail, helped establish Fort Worth as a trading and cattle center and earned it the nickname "Cowtown."

One of the more intriguing points of

history of Ft. Worth is that it is also known as Panther City. In 1875, the Dallas Herald published an article by a former Fort Worth lawyer, Robert E. Cowart. Mr. Cowart wrote that the decimation of Fort Worth's population, caused by the economic disaster and hard winter of 1873, had dealt a severe blow to the cattle industry. He further stated that the harm to the cattle industry, combined with the railroad stop being 30 miles outside of Fort Worth, had caused Fort Worth to become such a drowsy place that he saw a panther asleep in the street by the courthouse. Although an intended insult, the name Panther City was enthusiastically embraced when in 1876 Fort Worth recovered economically. When you go sightseeing, you will see many businesses with a panther logo.

When the Texas & Pacific Railway arrived in Fort Worth in 1876, it transformed Ft. Worth into a premier cattle industry and in wholesale trade. This helped the Ft. Worth population to grow. However, along with this growth came lawlessness. With cattlemen money being spent in Ft. Worth, growth of unsavory saloons appeared. The town soon became home to Hell's Half Acre, the biggest collection of bars, dance halls and bawdy houses south of Dodge City, Kansas. This section of town was considered off limits to the average citizens and unfortunately, as Ft. Worth grew, so did Hell's Half Acre. The law could not make inroads into the crime wave but it was the urban growth that helped improve the image of this area. In addition, the blacks who moved into this section also forced some of the criminal elements out. The death knell for the criminals to continue their business was the building of the major military training camp, Camp Bowie, at the outskirts of town in 1917. Martial law was put in place and that was the end of the outlaws' business. The Acre blended into the Ft. Worth community.

The archives recently acquired the anniversary program from West Virginia (40th). If your state is having a milestone anniversary, please make sure that the archives receive a copy. There have been inquiries from states requesting information about these programs. You can provide a copy to President Steve who will make sure that it gets to the archives. Also, past president Calvin Baerveldt #36419 and Pat Hoelker #45893 have started to provide materials to the archives. The archives is pleased that the materials from Doug Meyer's year is complete and is waiting for Past President Mike to provide the archives for his year. The archives is your history so if you have anything that is important and/or historical, get it in the archives. You may give the materials to President Steve or AVP Bruce Geddes and it will be forwarded on to the archives.

RETURN THE FAVOR

The Return The Favor program began under USJCI Senate President, Larry Sheeler (#16232) in 1987-88 as the "Yes We Can Help" program. It was developed as an offshoot of US Jaycee President Gary Wilkinson's "Yes We Can" theme. Later that same year the program was changed to "Return the Favor." The chairman that first year was Mike Harris (#24801) of North Carolina.

In 1994 the US Jaycees, under President Matthew Shapiro (#46859), began recognizing senators who did an outstanding job assisting Jaycees. When Shapiro started this, five or six senators were recognized on stage at the US Jaycee National Convention.

From those beginnings, JCI Senators have been recognized for outstanding efforts they have contributed to local Jaycee chapters and State Organizations. Senators have returned the favor to Jaycees by serving as judges for individual award competitions, providing training for local chapters and at statewide meetings and as a resource for new member recruitment. Many State Senate Organizations serve their Jaycees by hosting state meetings, providing staff for fundraising activities and serving as a mentor in the planning and presentation of other state Jaycee programs. All of these activities just scratch the surface of the support that Senators provide as they
