

Coming up on year-end, the United States JCI Senate will be contemplating at least two proposals for amendments to its By-Laws. Each of these is worthy of your due consideration. The first is a simple change to the timing by which the treasurer is to complete the year-end books and records and transfer them to his/her successor. Currently, Art. XII, sec. 9 E requires that this be accomplished by July 1. However, with the administrative year of the corporation ending on June 30 and the annual convention occurring a week to two weeks before that, there simply was insufficient time for the treasurer to meet this deadline. The proposed

amendment will extend the deadline to a more realistic date. You should find the report of the By-Laws Committee concerning this proposal elsewhere in Mentors.

Also coming up in the next few months is a re-make of the NASM amendment. Lessons were learned from the discussion and vote on the original proposal at the convention in Lyle in 2011. Changes were made to slim down the size of the amendment and to specifically address the issue of dues for the NASMs that seemed to be of concern. Hopefully, the revised proposal will address both the needs of the unaffiliated members without undue harm to the By-laws.

The new NASM proposal has been sent to all state organizations and will be considered by the Executive Committee in June. If approved by the Exec, it should come before you for consideration at the Fall Board Meeting.

As this "Where the Stars & Stripes and the Eagle Fly" year comes to a close, I hope each of you found it as exciting and rewarding as I have. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve you as Legal Counsel this year.

Let me close out the year with a famous exchange between Lady Astor and Winston Churchill: Lady Astor: Sir, if I were your wife, I would put poison in your tea!

Churchill: Madam, if you were my wife, I would drink it.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Hello fellow senators,

The Constitution & Bylaws committee met in Atlanta during the Wintor BOD meeting. 2 proposals were discussed and unanimously passed with recommendation to take before the executive board of directors.

The 1st issue:
Art. XII, Sec.7
Current bylaw

E. The treasure shall surrender the original books and records, copies of tax returns and other financial reports of the Corporation to the incoming Treasurer, no later than July 1st of the year he/she leaves office or when a successor is qualified.

Proposed by-law change

E. The treasure shall surrender the original books and records, copies of tax returns and other financial reports of the Corporation to the incoming Treasurer, no later than August 1st of the year he/she leaves office or when a successor is qualified.

This proposal was passed by the Executive Board of Directors with recommendation to take before the general membership for passage at the annual meeting in Orlando Florida. Pursuant to the constitution & by-laws this issue is now published in this issue

of the mentors for all membership to review and will be voted on in Orlando.

This 2nd issue was brought before the Executive Board of Directors in Atlanta and recommended for review for the Executive Board of Directors to take to all spring region meetings for membership review and discussion.

The Executive Board of Directors will review this issue in Orlando prior to the annual meeting.

If this issue is passed by the Executive Board of directors, it will then be published again in the next Mentors, pursuant to the constitution and bylaws for all membership to review and be voted on in Charleston, West Virginia at the fall board of directors meeting.

This is not the official notice but the draft of the language currently being made available to all senators for review.

Article IV - Membership
Add

Section 5

Any individual awarded a JCI Senatorship who resides in a state without an SOM affiliated with this corporation pursuant to Article V, or who relocates his/her residence to a state with an affiliated SOM that does not extend full membership to such relocated individual, shall be eligible for membership in this corporation as a Non-Affiliated State Member (NASM). No individual who is a member of any SOM affiliated with this corporation shall be eligible to become or remain a NASM.

Section 6

Non-Affiliated State members shall not be eligible to run for or hold any elected office in this corporation. NASMs may hold appointed office and, subject to Section 7, otherwise enjoy all rights and privileges of membership in this corporation.

Section 7

Participation in USJCI Senate Region activities by NASMs may be limited by each region. A SOM is not required to offer or accept membership of an NASM except in compliance with such SOM's constitution or by-laws.

Article V - State Organization Membership
Add

Section 5

At such time as the number of NASMs in any state without a SOM affiliated with this corporation reaches twenty (20), additional applications for memberships as an NASM in such state shall be denied. The corporation shall notify each NASM within said state that within one hundred eighty (180) days the twenty NASMs shall take all necessary steps to become an af-

iliated SOM chartered with this corporation in accordance with Article VI. The failure of said twenty NASMs to comply with this Section shall result in the non-renewal of their individual memberships as NASMs in this corporation.

Article VI - Dues

Add

Section 8

The amount of dues assessed to and collected from NASMs shall be two dollars (\$2.00) in excess of the yearly dues assessed for individual members of SOMs under Article VI, Section 1. Dues for NASMs shall be billed annually on an individual basis to each NASM and shall be due on January 1. First year dues for NASMs shall be prorated based upon the calendar date of membership.

PRESIDENTIAL SWEEPSTAKES PARTY

Regions Party 2012 - America - Land of the Free, Home of the Brave.

I hope to see everyone at the Regions Party on June 20th in Altamonte Springs, Florida. Below are the rules to ensure that we have a great fun event. I know that each of the Regions have some great ideas for their booths, I can't wait to see the results of your creativity. I will post the set up time at the registration table - usually it's 2 or 3 pm.

Manpower for set up will be 2 members per State, plus the NVP.

For judging & the VIP walk-thru, a maximum of 7 people including the NVP. (I know some Regions have more States than others, but we need to keep the number down during the judging & VIP walk-thru to hold down noise & confusion). After the judging & VIP walk-thru, you can have as many as you want behind the booth.

No one else is allowed in the room during the judging or VIP walk-thru except those manning the booth. If Chairman or NVP are not working the booth, they can be in the room, just make sure I know ahead of time.

If you are going to have music at your booth, make sure you don't drown out the other booths.

THERE CAN BE NO COOKING OR PREPARATION OF FOOD AT THE BOOTH. All food has to be prepared and mixed before you get to the booth. Please make sure all food & beverages are in 2 1/2 /3oz cups. You can use serving trays at the booth, but no crock-pots, blenders, etc. If you are serving alcohol, please serve the beverage (we have minors attending).

Each regional booth will be set up with 2 8ft tables in the front & 1 8 ft table on the side, forming an L shape. This will be set up by the hotel & will not be rearranged. (This may change when I receive the layout of the room from the hotel.

You can hang things on the walls; BUT the best tool to use is the blue painters tape. You can also use Black, red or white duck tape, or you can use the Command Strips. DO NOT USE GREY AS IT LEAVES A STICKY FILM WHEN REMOVED. REMEMBER, NO TAPE, STAPLES, PUSH PINS OR ANYTHING THAT PUTS A HOLE IN THE WALL. Remember if you need to ask the hotel to hang anything, there will be a charge.

Your space must be in the same condition when you leave as when you arrived.

At this time, we are not certain about ice, but we will know by June 1 (I hope). So you might want to plan on getting ice if you will need it.

Things you might need to bring: extension cords (please tape cords to floor), plastic gloves for serving food, serving trays, napkins, cups, paper towels, plastic for the floor (this does not have to cover the whole booth, just where beverages might be spilled, boom box, music, and blue painters tape. Remember to keep your booth neat and safe.

Judging Criteria: Best use of theme, Creativity, food/drink, booth/appearance, booth/friendly & overall impression.






