With the bang of the gavel it is over and begun. 2012-2013 is done and 2013-2014 is just getting started. As this Keeping Promises year of the US JCI Senate commences, it is a good time for each state organization to take a look its important papers to make sure they are current and in order.

Most, if not all, state senates are incorporated. Have you checked the requirements of your state of incorporation for periodic filing requirements? Many states require a not-for-profit corporation to file a statement of continued existence every so often. Failure to do so can result in the cancelation of your corporate status. Investigation should also be made into whether or not your senate is required to file federal tax returns or informational returns with the IRS. Similarly, if you enjoy 501(C)(3) status, there are periodic filings required by the IRS.

While not terribly exciting, attention to details such as these is important. As you start your senate's 2013 - 2014 year, squaring away these details now can avoid problems later on and even a fight with the IRS. Remember:


NORTH DAKOTA






