

PROGRAMS

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Fellow Senators, your Constitution & By-laws Committee has been hard at work for you, and has two proposed Bylaw amendments Bylaws to report today. These have been approved by the Executive Committee, and this written notice at least 30 days in advance allows for them to be presented for your consideration and vote during the Mid-Year BOD Meeting in Cocoa Beach, Florida, in January.

The first amendment impacts the ability of your Executive Committee to conduct official organizational business outside the two BOD meetings and the national convention. The second amendment changes the way a future vacancy for National Vice President will be filled, should one occur. The changes are noted below, with struck-out verbiage being removed and underlined italic verbiage being added.

Article VIII EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Sections 3a, 3c, & 4

Section 3

At any duly called meeting of the Executive Committee, two-thirds (2/3) of its members must be present and voting to constitute an official meeting. Business of the Corporation may be conducted between meetings subject to the following:

A. In all matters of the Corporation, the Executive Committee is empowered to vote proper and immediate actions ~~via the United States Postal Service, facsimile, or e-mail written or electronic communication, including but not exclusive to facsimile, e-mail, or conference call,~~ provided each member of the Committee has been informed regarding the question via notice sent by certified mail or facsimile or e-mail with receipt confirmation not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the deadline specified therein for return votes. Return votes shall be endorsed with the member's signature and date of the vote and returned to the Secretary by certified mail or facsimile or e-mail, *if needed*.

B. Responses shall be tabulated and recorded by the Secretary. The President and/or Secretary may issue announcement of the results.

C. Failure of members to return mail votes postmarked by the specified return deadline or via facsimile or e-mail by the specified return deadline, *or attend the conference call,* shall be considered an abstention by that member.

Section 4

All Executive Committee actions as defined in Sections 3A-3C of this Article are

subject to ratification by *to be reported to the Board of Directors at the next subsequent BOD meeting and by published minutes.*

Article XIV VACANCIES

Sections 1B, 1C, & 1D

Section 1

In the event any elected office becomes vacant by death, disability, resignation, or otherwise, the vacant office shall be filled as follows:

A. If the office vacated shall be the Presidency, the Administrative Vice President shall assume the title and duties of the office.

B. If the vacancy is for any other elected office of the Corporation, the President may appoint a successor to complete the un-expired term with approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the Executive Committee. Such vacancies shall be filled within thirty (30) days and may be voted upon via ~~the mails;~~ *as communication methods* specified in these By-Laws.

C. *If the vacancy is for a National Vice President, the presidents of the states of the affected region will select a successor within thirty (30) days.*

D. In the event of the Presidency being vacated, the successor to that office shall honor the appointments made by his predecessor in order to ensure continuity in programming and to avoid disruption of current services and activities. *[NOTE: This was 1C but becomes 1D with the addition above.]*

MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION SERVICES

The first quarter of our membership year is over. There were a total of 1,849 members due in September. There were 126 members dropped and 116 new adds for a net membership change of -10. Five regions grew with Region IV being the largest growth region at +9. A total of 15 states grew with Alabama being the largest growth state at +9 followed by Ohio at +7. As the result of the September dues activities, the US JCI Senate membership is 7,895.

The December dues kits have been sent out. We have a total of 1,935 members due for the second quarter. With the Thanksgiving holiday just prior to the submission deadline of December 1st, I encourage state treasurers to submit their dues activity early. Remember, a copy of the Dues Submission Sheet and your checks are to be sent to Treasurer, John Robinson.

Perhaps you have noticed that the list of Senators who have passed away recently is unfortunately getting longer. This is placing a burden on both the states and US to grow for the year. With the number of senatorships being awarded in a decreasing mode, it becomes all more important for each state organization to make an attempt to activate non-member Senators into our organization to replace these lost Senators.

Another area of responsibility under Membership is the Mentors mailing list. The initial mailing was made in August to everyone who is currently a member of a state organization. The cost to mail the Mentors is quite a demanding portion of our budget. Many Senators are members of multiple state organizations. Therefore, you may be receiving more than one copy of Mentors each mailing. I ask that if you are a multiple member Senator and only want to receive 1 copy of each Mentors, please let me know so that I can remove additional copies from the mailing list. Thus, we can reduce postage costs.

In addition to multiple-state memberships, it is common to have both a husband and wife within the same household receiving a copy of Mentors. Several Senate couples have requested to only have one copy mailed to them each issue. This is another method by which we can reduce the number of copies to be printed and postage costs. Again, I ask that you inform me if your household only needs one copy.

One last area that needs attention is that of addresses. Our master membership list has a total of 118 members who do not show an address. This list is compiled from each of the state rosters. It is very important that you keep your Treasurer informed of your current address so that National and state communications can be properly received at your correct address and our respective rosters can be updated with correct information. Your state treasurer can submit the address change to me at any time to update the master state roster information.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my first several months in this position and look forward to meeting and working with the state treasurers throughout the year.








NORTH DAKOTA

Over the summer, we held our annual Day at Emerald Downs, the WAJCI Wings Day at Buffalo Wild Wings, the Dayton Craze campout in Touchet, and our joint meeting with the Washington Jaycees in Ellensburg. All of these events gave us an opportunity to gather as Jaycees and as Senators to not only celebrate being Jaycees, but more importantly, rekindle the bonds with the State Jaycees. My goal is to continue the momentum of this effort. And it seems to be working.

At the WAJCI State meeting, we were asked to provide training on Recruiting Members. At this training, we offered a membership challenge that would encourage past and present members to help bring in new members. The prizes of a private airplane tour and of a Seattle Seahawks game are both significant and achievable. In October, we were invited to help out with the Pasco Jaycee's Haunted Forest. In November, we were asked to participate in the Seattle Jaycee's "Nothing But Nets" Fundraiser. The local chapters are asking us to do things with them. This is a huge deal.

Last year, I was the Treasurer for the Washington State JCI Senate. It was an honor to serve in this role. At one of our meetings, I was presented with a Presidential Award from National President Bruce. I have this plaque at my work desk and look at it on a daily basis. Our First Timer Program Manager, Jay Stumpf, and I wanted to do something a little different this year. So, I asked and was given permission to use his symbol for our First Timers program. This year, instead of giving the winner of the First Timer Program a plaque that might easily be found at the bottom of a drawer, we decided to give out something usable as well as symbolic: embroidered briefcases with the Inukshuk symbol.

The legend is that this stone symbol of the Inukshuk represents balance between separate entities, which support and are supported by, the one above and the one below it. It recognizes our ability to succeed with others, where we would fail alone. It reminds us of our need to belong to something greater than ourselves. It reinforces our ability to create, communicate and commit to common goals. The Inukshuk reminds us of our interdependent responsibilities to

invest our efforts today to direct a better way for all of us tomorrow.

But we wanted to add a little symbolism and Jaycee tie-in to the emblem. We came up with the idea that each stone would represent a tenet in the success of the Jaycees in Washington. Here is the meaning of each stone in the structure:

The feet are the foundation of the structure. These two stones represent the First Timer and the New Member of the Jaycees. The legs are the main support structure and represent the Local Chapter and the State Senate. The bond that holds the Jaycees together is Communication. The next 3 stones represent the core of the organization: Training, Projects, and Involvement. Shouldering the responsibility of these concepts is the state leadership. At the top is everyone's goal, a Successful Washington Jaycees Organization.

The Washington JCI Senate is a crucial component for the Jaycees. We need them to succeed; they need us for support. Over the next few months, I plan on offering monthly activities. Some of them will be just for Senators. At others, we will be extending invitations to the Jaycees to join us. In addition, I plan on working with next year's WA Jaycee leadership and encouraging them to invite us to their projects. I ask you to take advantage of these opportunities when offered.

Currently, we are working to hold the next Senate/Jaycees meeting jointly. Keep an eye on your email and our website for more details about this. Make a point to attend the monthly activities (like the Senate Christmas Party in December). And, always feel free to suggest ideas for future gatherings.


