I look forward to serving you as your 44th President in this year of WE BELIEVE.



Welcome to the start of another USJCI Senate year – the WE BELIEVE year! Once again, it is my privilege to

serve as your Legal Counsel. And, as always at the beginning of the year, there are some points to ponder I feel should be passed on.

I serve as legal counsel and attorney to the United States JCI Senate. If you have questions or concerns about the national organization, its operations, by-laws or your senate's interaction with it, I am the person to contact. However, this office does not serve as attorney for any individual state organization, member or officer. Such a task would be impossible. The variety of individual state by-laws and the plethora of attending state laws reduce any advice I would give to generalities, indeed. However, if you have a problem and would like to talk it over with me, I am always available. So feel free to call or email me at any time. After all, I'm (from the government and) here to help! Feel free to email your by-laws to me for a more enlightened discussion.

Consequently, I strongly urge each state organization to have its own legal counsel. He or she should be an attorney licensed in

your state you know your organization, your by-laws, your state laws and your situation. Such a person can provide much more valuable advice applicable to your peculiar situation. Most state senates have one or two attorney members sitting around. Most would do the job for the asking and perhaps a big badge.

Finally, as the year begins it is an appropriate time for your senate legal counsel to check your senate's status with appropriate governmental agencies. Some states, such as Ohio, will cancel a corporate charter if no activity is reported to the state secretary of state at least once every five years. You may be in a similar situation. Most states require a corporation to have a statutory agent. Do you have one? Do you know who it is? Is he/she still alive? And are you up-to-date on any necessary tax filings? Now is a good time to check. These are pesky details, but important ones. Get them taken care of early and you can enjoy the rest of your year!

So, as we enter into this We Believe year, remember that we are all in this together, always available to help and support one another.

I have been the North Dakota Jaycee Senate Scholarship Coordinator since we began our program in 2010 resulting in several national winners as well. These scholarships are near to my heart since ND Senate Scholarships are given as a memorial to my daughter Lisa who was a Jaycee kid and passed away in a car accident in 2009. I plan to be a mentor for the new pro-

gram administrator and hope for continued success in this program.

Like many other states, the North Dakota Jaycee organization has suffered in recent years, directly affecting our Senate's new membership and activities. I plan to focus on events designed to get our existing Senators active and bring new energy to the group. I believe this new energy we develop will help bring discussion about potential new senatorships for those former Jaycees who are excellent candidates but not recognized due to their local chapters' demise.

In closing, I am honored to have been elected North Dakota Jaycee Senate President and look forward to good times and good people.



Ellison Onizuka.


Out of town guests included 2014-15 US



I recently returned from the Annual Meeting in Rochester, where Treasurer Pete Reinecker and I had the opportunity to meet with some of the state treasurers, state presidents and NVPs about the membership dues process. I look forward to serving as Membership Information Services Program Manager again this year and working with a new group of treasurers.

Our membership ended up on the plus side for the fourth consecutive year. We began the year with a membership base of 7,991 and ended the year at 7,992 enabling us to grow for the 4th consecutive year. A total of 23 states grew for the year and 3 regions grew for the year. The largest growth state was Texas at +63, followed by Florida at +11 and Illinois at +8. Region VIII at +58, Region IV at +16 and Region II at +10 were the growth regions.

A total of 1,804 members are due in the First Quarter. September dues kits and rosters were sent out to the state treasurers and state presidents for which I have information around July 15th. Some of the name and email addresses I have are for last year. If you are not the current treasurer or president, please forward the dues kit to the current individuals. I would also like an email informing me of the correct person and their email address. The first quarter dues kits are due to me by September 1st. All checks for the first quarter are due to Treasurer Pete Reinecker as soon as possible after your submission.

In addition to handling membership, I am responsible for maintaining the Mentors mailing list. In order for you to receive your Mentors, we need a current address. I strongly encourage any senator who changes their address to utilize one of several means in submitting that change to me: 1) send me an email; 2) complete the address change form located on the inside front cover and mail it to me; or 3) submit your new address and information on the Change of Address form found on the US Senate website. Upon receiving your notification of an address change, I will

notify your state organization... but I also encourage you to notify your state treasurer of your information change.

Another issue is the 543 duplicate addresses on the Mentors mailing list. These are mostly husband and wife each receiving a copy. If you only need 1 copy of Mentors in your household, please send me an email to that effect.


