Heather Vardell joined the Cayce-West Columbia Jaycees Chapter in South Carolina in February, 2009.

While on the chapter board, she served as Individual Development Vice President and as a two-term Local President. She was recognized by the South Carolina Jaycees as both Outstanding Vice President and Outstanding Local President. In her two years as chapter president, the chapter finished in second place and first place, respectively, as the South Carolina chapter of the year. In 2011, Heather was recognized with the Charles Kulp, Jr. Memorial Award by the United States Junior Chamber. At the first planning meeting, they approved half of the same awarding winning programs and the other half that members wanted including bartending, disco dancing, and likable introductions because I used to do all three jobs bartending, Disco DJ, and asking people to fill the dance floor at a night club in Boston as a student. Then I was told to find Chairmen.

When we got to the CDVP planning, I asked where the women are because my sister recruited me. They laughed at a First Timer and said Honolulu Chinese Jaycees was an all men's organization. So I asked why we don't have a cultural program like a beauty pageant. They laughed again because the Chinese Chamber already ran the Narcissus Pageant for years. Second place won Miss Chinatown and got a trip to San Francisco's Miss Chinatown USA Pageant. So wrote a letter to the USA Pageant and asked permission to run a Miss Chinatown Pageant in Honolulu. The USA Pageant said it was ok if the local Chinese Chamber approved. To our chapter's surprise, the local Chinese Chamber thought Narcissus was enough and Miss Chinatown was too much trouble to fund, so they let us take it. We visited the USA Pageant, wrote a CPG and trained men, women and contestants in personal and leadership development and positions. Miss Chinatown continues to help young people today to enlightening our community about our culture.

The US JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship program is going strong!! The program is in full swing and lots of states are already receiving applications back. The US JCI Senate and US JCI Senate Foundation websites have the guidelines, application and list of state chairmen listed. A very special thank you to Logan Giesie and Earl Sawyer for their continued support on getting that information posted on the websites.

Last year was a record breaking year for participation in the scholarship program. Because the number of applications submitted each year is growing, I want to be sure each and every student is given full consideration and can get the maximum number of points during judging. I'd like to share a few reminders with each of you before you submit your final two applications for national judging. Make sure each application is fully completed; the student has signed the application; their name and page number is listed on the top of each sheet of the application and extra pages; and the application should be neat and easy to read. Be sure the student has completed their personal statement within the limits on the form (100 - 300 words). The judges do not know any of these students and while they would like to know as much as possible to be more familiar with the student, they don't have time to read several pages from each entry. I would hate for your entry to be downgraded or disqualified because the student didn't follow the guidelines and rules. The deadline for the student to submit their application to you is **January 20, 2017**. Then you have until **February 17, 2017** to have the state judging completed and mail your applications to me.

I was asked at one of the last meetings if we had considered raising the amount of the scholarships above \$1,000 because that didn't seem like very much money for the trouble of completing the applica-

tion. Really?? After checking with a few other organizations, our \$1,000 amount is in the higher level. Many organizations offer between \$200 – 800 per student. The cost of education is getting out of control. The average cost of tuition per student for the 2015-2016 year is \$32,400 for a private university; \$23,800 for out-of-state tuition and over \$9,000 for a student attending a public school. No wonder we have so many students trying to get our scholarships. They need every single dollar they can get to help them through their university expenses. I think you will be able to tell by some of the thank-you notes throughout this issue of *Mentors* that the students are very appreciative and grateful for the scholarship. This is a life-altering experience for most of these students.

And to answer the question about giving more money to the students, all I can say is that we have to raise a ton more money to be in a position to make any changes. We have some pretty hefty goals set for our organization and hopefully someday will be in a position to offer more money and more scholarships to the students. But since we only use the interest from our monies for the scholarship, it is imperative that we raise as much money as possible at every single event to continue to be successful each year. You might consider starting a membership (or growing someone's membership level) as a special Christmas or holiday gift. It is the gift that keeps on giving and growing and making a difference in the lives of many students across our nation.

Please let me know if you need any assistance with the program or judging. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone in Houston, TX.






I would like to thank you for the opportunity to receive the United States JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship.

The first quarter of our membership year is completed. There were a total of 1,801 members due in September. There were 70 members dropped and 101 new adds for a net growth of +31. This is exceptionally good when you consider 29 of our dropped members were the result of deceased members. As the result of the September dues activities, the US JCI Senate membership is 8,037.

Five regions grew for the quarter with Region 2 leading the way at +22 followed by Region 3 at +13, Region 7 at +8, Region 8 at +3 and Region 4 at +2. A total of 15 states grew for the quarter with New Jersey being the largest growth state at +18. Virginia was +14 and Tennessee finished at +5. The other growth states were: Pennsylvania, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, South Dakota, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

The December dues kits were sent out in early October. Due to the submission deadline for this issue of Mentors, I am unable to report the results even though they are known while you read this article. To view the second quarter results, they can be found on the USJCI Senate website. We had a total of 1,904 due for the quarter. Hopefully, we had another growth quarter to help the US Senate enjoy its 6th consecutive year of growth.

Another area of responsibility under Membership is the Mentors mailing list. It is common to have both a husband and wife within the same household receiving a copy of Mentors. One of the goals of President Jim is to reduce the number of dual Mentors being sent to the same

address. To date, 229 couples have requested to only have one copy mailed to them each issue. We still have 363 duplicate addresses on the Mentors mailing list. Again, I ask that you inform me if your household only needs one copy.

Another area that I want to address is that of deceased senators. The number of deceased members being dropped seems to be increasing. We have a total of 41 deceased senators being dropped in the first two quarters of this year. A big reason for this increase is states not being made aware of a member passing away. I receive notices quite frequently from family members requesting to have the deceased senator removed from the Mentors mailing list who has been gone for several years. To avoid any unnecessary mailings or contacts with a deceased senator, please let your state organization or myself know as soon as you learn of the death of a senator so their family does not receive unwanted publications. As states receive such information, make sure to let Chaplain Hilda Davis know so they can be included in bi-monthly E-News and the year-end memorial service.

Another area that needs mentioning is that of addresses. With people moving all the time, it is important that your state has a current address for you. It is very important to keep your treasurer informed of your current address so that National and state communications can be properly received at your correct address and our rosters can be updated with correct information. You can also inform me of an address change using an email, sending me the address change notice found on the inside cover of Mentors or completing the Change of Address form found on the US Senate website. The post office provided me 83 changes of address. They also provided a list of 267 "undeliverable addresses". An effort is being made to get the correct address for thee individuals so that they can receive all mailings from the state and National Senate organizations.

One final topic is the opportunity to now receive your Mentors electronically. For those interested, you can now receive Mentors electronically instead of the normal paper copy. If you wish to replace your paper copy with an electronic copy, go to the USJCI Senate website and complete the information on the link "Electronic Mentors" and submit it.



Greetings US JCI Senate and friends,

With the recent controversy and discussion on protocol for our National Flag & Anthem, I would like to share the following taken from the United States Flag Code:

Pledge of Allegiance and National Anthem

- When reciting the Pledge of Allegiance, all present should stand at attention facing the flag with their right hand over their heart, with the exception of those in uniform who shall salute.
- The National Defense Authorization Act of 2008 contained an amendment to allow un-uniformed service members, military retirees, and veterans to render a hand salute during the hoisting, lowering, or passing of the U.S. flag.

A later amendment further authorized hand-salutes during the national anthem by veterans and out-of-uniform military personnel. This was included in the Defense Authorization Act of 2009, which President Bush signed on Oct. 14, 2008. Public Law 113-66, enacted on 26 December 2013, reaffirmed this authorization.

When the national anthem is played or sung:

1. Designation: The composition consisting of the words and music known as the Star-Spangled Banner is the national anthem.
2. Conduct During Playing: During a rendition of the national anthem:

When the flag is displayed:

1. Individuals in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note;
2. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute in the manner provided for individuals in uniform; and
3. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, and men not in uniform, if applicable, should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left
