

when you consider whether you should go to a funeral or not, remember this.

"I believe in always going to the funeral. My father taught me that. The first time he said it directly to me, I was 16 and trying to get out of going. I did not want to go. My father was unequivocal. "Dee," he said, "you're going. Always go to the funeral. Do it for the family."

She is a freelance attorney living in Brooklyn. Sullivan says her father's greatest gift to her and her family was how he ushered them through the process of his death.

So my dad waited outside while I went in. It was worse than I thought it would be: I was the only kid there. When the condolence line deposited me in front of Miss Emerson's shell-shocked parents, I stammered out, "Sorry about all this," and stalked away. But, for that deeply weird expression of sympathy delivered 20 years ago, Miss Emerson's mother still remembers my name and always says hello with tearing eyes.

By the time I was 16, I had been to five or six funerals. I remember two things from the funeral circuit: bottomless dishes of free mints and my father saying on the ride home, "You can't come in without going out, kids. Always go to the funeral."

Sounds simple — when someone dies, get in your car and go to calling hours or the funeral. That, I can do. But I think a personal philosophy of going to funerals means more than that.

"Always go to the funeral" means that I have to do the right thing when I really, really don't feel like it. I have to remind myself of it when I could make some small gesture.

In going to funerals, I've come to believe that while I wait to make a grand heroic gesture, I should just stick to the small inconveniences that let me share in life's inevitable, occasional calamity.

On a cold April night three years ago, my father died a quiet death from cancer. His funeral was on a Wednesday, middle of the workweek. I had been numb for days when, for some reason, during the funeral, I turned and looked back at the folks in the church. The memory of it still takes my breath away. The most human, powerful and humbling thing I've ever seen was a church at 3:00 on a

Wednesday full of inconvenienced people who believe in going to the funeral." Deirdre Sullivan grew up in Syracuse, N.Y.

Thanks again and don't forget those hugs!!!



Where has the time gone?! It seems just a few months ago we were in Greensboro celebrating the end of another fabulous Senate year, and here we are in June. Time certainly does march on....

I first want to thank all the members of the Future Directions committee for their time, commitment, ideas and input. It has truly been my honor and pleasure to serve with each of you: Mary Anne Johnson from Region I, Scott Kingsley from Region II, Denise Bauer from Region IV, Gary Richey from Region V, Dan Badger from Region VI, Larry Norfleet from Region VII, DeLisa Anderson from Region VIII, Angie Stanchfield from Region IX and Phil Friedman from Region X.

As we committed to you earlier in the year, our committee sent out an electronic survey in December which included several questions that we felt were important issues to our organization: regional realignment, the cost of a senatorship, the timing and length of national meetings, the location of national meetings and thoughts around meeting with the Jaycees. The response rate was around 5%, which is generally considered very good for a survey.

Below are the results:

Regional realignment: 40% in favor / 42% not in favor

Cost of a senatorship: 62% appropriately priced / 23% not appropriate (many of the responses here were that it was too low or that this is Jaycee recognition and the Senate should not involve themselves in this matter).

Timing/length of meetings: 33% convenient / 58% not convenient (the responses to this question revolved mostly around the year-end convention and that it is held over the course of a work week. Working senators would like to see it moved around a weekend so that they do not have to use so much valuable vacation time to attend these events.)

Location of meetings: 69% said location is a factor in their decision to attend / 25% said it doesn't matter

Meeting with the Jaycees: 83% in favor of having more interaction with the Jaycees / 8% not in favor

As you can see, the results were very telling. We also received several interesting ideas and suggestions for possible activities at conventions: regional competitions, dancing lessons/contest, morning show, tradeshow/hobbies booths, hours of power/motivational speakers, yoga classes, and relevant speakers.

THANK YOU to everyone who participated in this important survey! We want you to know that your voice was heard and our plan is to start with convening task forces around 2 of the issues that seemed to receive the most comments: meeting with the Jaycees and the timing and length of national meetings. These groups will be formed at the June meeting in Chicago and we will continue to keep you updated on our progress.

The committee is also open to your input and suggestions via the suggestion box on the USJCI Senate website, so please feel free to use that method as well.

As always, please don't hesitate to reach out to me or any member of the committee with any questions, comments or concerns you may have.

It has been my honor to serve as your committee chair this past year and I've thoroughly enjoyed serving with all the dedicated members of this committee!

Since the last issue of Mentors, we have completed two more quarters of membership. There were a total of 1,905 members due in December of which 83 members were dropped and 79 new adds for a net change of -4. Four regions grew in December with Region 4 leading the way at +12, followed by Region 9 at +6, Region 3 at +5 and Region 2 at +1. There were a total of 16 growth states: NJ,MD,VA,AL,FL,GA,NC,SC,IN,MI,TN,TX,MT,OR,AZ,HI. The top growth states for December were Virginia, Florida and Oregon all at +5. After December, the US JCI Senate membership was 8,033 which is a net growth of +27 for the year.

For March, there were a total of 1,765 members due. We dropped 72 and added 114 new members for a net growth of +42. This enables the US JCI Senate to be +69 for the year. A total of six regions grew in March with Region 5 finishing at +18, followed by Region 3 at +17, Region 4 at +8, Region 6 at +7 and Regions 2 and 7 at +1. There were a total of 22 states at growth: DE,NJ,PA,DC,MD,VA,AL,FL,GA,NC,SC,IL,IN,KY,MI,OH,IA,MO,WI,TN,O K,AZ. The top growth states were led by Maryland at +19. Illinois was at +8 and Michigan was at +7. June is our final and largest quarter of the year with 2,535 members due.

With one final quarter remaining this year, there are currently 6 regions and 21 states at growth. Our current membership is 8,075. The highest our year-end membership has reached is 8,123 at the end of the 2007-2008 administrative year under President Jumper Davis. Surpassing that level is obtainable. A growth of 49 would do it. Certainly you know of an older senator who is not currently a member of your state organization. Encourage them to pay dues and join your group. Also, don't forget to ask the newer senators receiving their senatorships recently to join our organization. An effort that combines these two resources will enable us to reach our goal.

The June dues kits have been sent out to each state. With the Annual Meeting

scheduled for the third week of June, it is extremely important that dues kits be submitted by the June 1st deadline in order to finalize year-end reports. With a continued strong effort, the US JCI Senate can grow for the 6th consecutive year and reach the 8,100+ member level.

The membership results by state and region for each of the first three quarters can be viewed on the US JCI Senate website under Resources/Library, Reports and Forms Library and BOD Reports/Membership.

Another area of responsibility under Membership is the Mentors mailing list. It is common to have both a husband and wife within the same household receiving a copy of Mentors. One of the goals of President Jim is to reduce the number of dual Mentors being sent to the same address. To date, 233 couples have requested to only have one copy mailed to them each issue. We still have 359 duplicate addresses on the Mentors mailing list. Again, I ask that you inform me if your household only needs one copy.

For those interested, you can now receive Mentors electronically instead of the normal paper copy. If you wish to replace your paper copy with an electronic copy, go to the USJCI Senate website and complete the information on the link "Electronic Mentors" and submit it.

This year will complete my 4th year in this position. I want to thank the state treasurers and state presidents for doing a great job in submitting dues kits and roster changes in order to keep our records updated.

Finally, I want to thank President Jim and Treasurer Lawrence for allowing me the opportunity to serve the US JCI Senate.



Created as part of the top secret Manhattan Project during World War II, B Reactor produced the plutonium used in the Trinity Test (the world's first nuclear detonation) in July 1945, as well as for the atomic bomb dropped on Nagasaki, Japan in August 1945 that contributed to the Japanese surrender and end of World War II. Tour starts at 10:45 AM and lasts about 4 hours. We will provide transportation to the drop site where you load onto to the tour bus. *We have not determined if we are able to provide a lunch with this tour yet.

Bechtel National Planetarium
