HAPPY HOLIDAYS EVERYONE



Greetings from New York,




November 3, we kicked it up again with John & Marsha Dahl hosting their annual Holiday party. Friday night those who came in early dine together at a restaurant.

Please type <http://enews2019.hosted.phplist.com/lists/?p=subscribe&id=1> into the search bar and follow the instructions. This will "assure" the program we use for distribution that you have requested these emails. This link to subscribe is also on the website Home Page. You also now have the option to unsubscribe if you reach a point where you no longer desire receipt of the Enews. These two steps can be used if you change your email address. Unsubscribe from the old address and subscribe to the new one. The unsubscribe option is at the very bottom of the Enews.

There have been email addresses that for whatever reason our program cannot deliver. There are many possibilities including a Spam blocker that the

addressee installed on their system at some time, often during setup. Listing the distribution address (e-news@usjcisenate.org) as a known contact in your account often solves the problem and subscribing as indicated above should fix the issue. If you think you are on the master list but do not see Enews in your inbox please check you SPAM folder or other JUNK folder. Again, if you do not have the distribution address listed as a known contact your Enews can be diverted by your "SMART" "email program! Just as an FYI I have firsthand experience with this occurrence!

The first quarter of our membership year is completed. I really appreciate the efforts of this year's team of Treasurers who did a good job in submitting their dues by the September 1st deadline. This sure makes it easier to prepare reports and finalize the money part with Treasurer Mike. This is always a challenge when the deadline is Labor Day weekend and the Fall BOD Meeting is less than two weeks away.

The US JCI Senate had 1,848 members due this quarter. There was a total of 98 members dropped and 82 new adds for a net change of -16. This is good when you consider 35 of our dropped members were the result of deceased members. Three regions grew for the quarter with Region 2 being the largest growth region at +10 followed by Region 10 at +3 and Region 3 at +2. A total of 12 states grew with District of Columbia being the largest growth state at +7 followed by New Jersey at +6 and South Carolina at +5. The other growth states were: Vermont, New York, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Missouri, South Dakota, Texas, California and Hawaii. As the result of the September dues activities, the US JCI Senate membership is 7,987.

The December dues kits were sent out in early October. Due to the submission deadline for this issue of Mentors, I am unable to report the results even though they are known while you read this article. To view the second quarter results, they can be found on the USJCI Senate website. We had a total of 1,864 due for the quarter. Hopefully, we had a growth quarter to help the US Senate enjoy a year of growth.

Unfortunately, the US JCI Senate has lost 35 deceased members during the first quarter. There are 20 known deceased members due in December. The number of deceased members being dropped seems to be increasing. A big reason for this increase is states not being made aware of a member passing away. I receive notices quite frequently from family members requesting to have the deceased senator removed from the Mentors mailing list who has been gone for several years. To avoid any unnecessary mailings or contacts with a deceased senator, please let your state organization or myself know as soon as you learn of the death of a senator

so their family does not receive unwanted publications. As states receive such information, make sure to let US Senate Chaplain Vette Sutton know so they can be included in bi-monthly E-News and the year-end memorial service.

Another area of responsibility under Membership is the Mentors mailing list. It is common to have both a husband and wife within the same household receiving a copy of Mentors. To date, 270 couples have requested to only have one copy mailed to them each issue. We still have 322 duplicate addresses on the Mentors mailing list. Again, I ask that you inform me if your household only needs one copy at gpitt1@comcast.net.

Another area that needs mentioning is that of addresses. With people moving all the time, it is important that your state has a current address for you. It is very important to keep your treasurer informed of your current address so that National and state communications can be properly received at your correct address and our rosters can be updated with correct information. You can also inform me of an address change using an email, sending me the address change notice found on the inside cover of Mentors or completing the Change of Address form found on the US Senate website.

Finally, is the opportunity to now receive your Mentors electronically. Currently, there are 153 senators receiving their Mentors in this manner. For those interested, you can now receive Mentors electronically instead of the normal paper copy. If you wish to replace your paper copy with an electronic copy, go to the USJCI Senate website and complete the information on the link "Electronic Mentors" and submit it.

SOCIAL MEDIA DIRECTOR

Communication is consistently ranked as one of the top failures in every organization,

from businesses to non and not-for-profit entities. One of the challenges of effective communication is that we all communicate differently, and what one-person thinks is a clear message, another struggles with understanding. Adding to this struggle is the increasing number of ways in which we can communicate with each other. Once upon a time in the not so distant past, our communication options were limited to in-person meetings, snail-mail correspondence, and the home telephone.

In 1990, with the release of *Pretty Woman* the world became enamored with the car phone, as shown by the 'brick' that Richard Gere's character used. Today however, car phones, and quite frequently even home phones, are a thing of the past. Nearly every person has at least one cell phone, the majority of which are "smart phones." And while cell phones have run the range on sizes, trending towards as small as possible around 2005 through much larger screens again today, every cell phone can still fit in a pocket or purse and truly be mobile.

Why should the state Senate organizations care about the trends in communication and the capability of a phone? With new generations demanding access to more

information, and communication becoming more challenging than ever, our State Senate organizations must build a comprehensive communication plan to ensure that all Senators, regardless of generational technology, receive and understand the message from the organization.

While Facebook is rapidly becoming a dated social media medium, it continues to be the primary social media platform for most of our Senators from 100 – mid-thirties. The true value of social media can only be seen when it is used on a consistent basis with numerous posts throughout a week. While State and Region Senate groups are using social media pages and groups, ensure that the message being provided is relevant, timely, and inclusive of all members of the organization and that message is carried through the meetings, e-mails, and websites for consistent branding. This message will be seen on phones more often than computers, so ensure that it is written to be read quickly (concise statements) and visually (great graphics).

As a State Senate organization, review your communication plan, build social media into it, and recognize that your better comprehensive communication plan building on all communication mediums will best allow you to "reach out" to all your Senators and Jaycees.





