

As is customary, I will start this new year with the admonition that each Senate Organization take a few minutes to review its organization and official documents to make sure everything is up to snuff. Of course, being healthy and politically correct, we don't promote snuff.

Every state has its own laws and regulations governing organizations such as the Senate. Each state has its own laws and regulations governing non-profits and their activities. Consequently, the following is general information, only. For specifics, you should consult your own Senate's legal counsel or an attorney licensed in your state experienced in these matters.

Most Senates are organized as corporations not-for-profit. Once incorporated, most states require periodic updates or registrations, perhaps every five years. A failure to register could result in the loss or cancellation of your corporate status. Usually, you can go on line to your state government's website to check



on the applicable requirements and the status of your registration.

Likewise, depending upon your Senate's activities, you may or may not need to be filing any one or more of a number of tax forms. Consult a local tax practitioner for what you should be doing.

A little attention to the details now can prevent a whole lot of problems (and expenses) later on.

So, as we begin this new year, how about a little advice from Shakespeare?

This can typically be completed on-line and may require a fee and/or annual renewals. Why should we incorporate, you may ask? Well, there are several important reasons for incorporating:

- To limit your personal liability from the Organization's events
- Your Organization makes a profit on its activities
- Your Organization is applying for public or private grant money
- Your Organization will solicit tax-deductible donations or contributions and
- Your Organization will be seeking tax-exemption

Once you have incorporated your State Organization, don't forget to file the required documents each year! Once your Organization is incorporated, the next step is to file for tax-exempt status with the IRS. For





donate the stock, rather than selling it, there are no capital gains to show. This way, you avoid owing capital gains tax on the appreciation and still can claim the full value of the assets as a charitable contribution. Again, this can be bunched with other itemized deductions.

The best method is to not have the charitable contribution be a deduction, but never be included in your income tax in the first place. Taxpayers who are 70 ½ or older may make a distribution directly from their retirement account to a qualified charity. If done correctly, the income won't be added to taxable income, but you won't receive a charitable contribution deduction either. The contribution must be sent from your broker or custodian to the charity. You can't just take the money out then write a check to the charity. This is more tax efficient, because it is a 100% deduction.

Charitable organizations, such as your JCI Senate Foundation, encourage you to donate for the good cause, and great if you get an income tax advantage. But taxes should not be your sole motivation.




