NOTICE OF PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Article XX, Section 1, Amendments of the Bylaws of the United States JCI Senate, Inc., amended June 20, 2018, the following four (4) proposals for amendment changes or additions to the Bylaws of the United States JCI Senate, Inc. will be considered at the Winter Board of Directors meeting at 9:00am on January 25, 2020 in Melbourne, Florida. Proposed amendment additions are in **BOLD CAPITAL LETTERS**. Deletions have a ~~line through them~~.

ARTICLE VI DUES

Section 1 Each affiliated SOM shall pay dues to the Corporation at the annual rate of \$5.00 per member Senator. **COMMENCING WITH DUES PAYABLE ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2020, EACH AFFILIATED SOM SHALL PAY DUES TO THE CORPORATION AT THE ANNUAL RATE OF \$7.00 PER MEMBER SENATOR.** At least \$2.50 of the dues shall be expended only for official publications. No SOM shall pay less than an amount equal to twenty (20) members.

This proposal is the result of months of research by the Future Directions, Constitution & By-Laws, Finance and Executive Committees. The research included looking at all of the areas that have been reduced or eliminated from the budget over the past several years, projecting future inflationary increases and future membership projections. Dues have remained at their current levels since 1988, and an increase of \$2.00 per year is modest. Without the proposed dues increase, rising expenses, including member services, such as the publication of Mentors, and our officer's ability to serve our members at US National JCI Senate, state and regional JCI Senate functions will not be able to be maintained at their current level.

ARTICLE VII BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 5 Each **INDIVIDUAL** member of the BOD shall only have one vote, with a maximum of two votes per SOM. **INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS SHALL NOT CAST A VOTE AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF MORE THAN ONE SOM.** Additionally, the President, Administrative Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Vice Presidents, and Chairman of the Board shall have one vote each provided, however that said officers shall not cast votes as both officer and as a representative of an SOM. In accordance with ARTICLE XVIII, Section 3, the President, Administrative Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Vice Presidents, and Chairman of

the Board shall not have a separate vote in the elections of officers, whom shall be elected solely by the SOM's.

This proposal is to make clear that voting in the Senate is a "one Senator one vote" system. While individual Senators may belong to more than one State Senate, this proposal specifies that regardless of the number of Senates a Senator may belong to, each individual Senator can only vote one time.

ARTICLE X FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Section 2 The Finance Committee shall be responsible for **CAUSING A YEAR-END FINANCIAL AUDIT OR REVIEW TO BE CONDUCTED. SAID AUDIT OR REVIEW SHALL BE CONDUCTED BY recommending a AN INDEPENDENT Certified Public Accountant(s), or Certified Public Accounting Firm, OR THE AUDIT COMMITTEE APPOINTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 16 OF THIS ARTICLE, to conduct either an annual year-end financial audit or review as determined by the Finance Committee, PROVIDED THAT NOT LESS THAN ONCE EVERY FIVE (5) YEARS THE AUDIT OR REVIEW SHALL BE PERFORMED BY THE INDEPENDENT CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT OR CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTING FIRM.**

SECTION 16 (NEW) IN THE EVENT THE FINANCE COMMITTEE DETERMINES THAT THE YEAR-END FINANCIAL AUDIT OR REVIEW SHALL BE PERFORMED BY THE AUDIT COMMITTEE, SAID COMMITTEE SHALL BE ESTABLISHED AND SHALL OPERATE AS FOLLOWS:

A. THE AUDIT COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIST OF THREE (3) MEMBERS ONE OF WHOM SHALL BE A PAST TREASURER OF THE CORPORATION. NONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE AUDIT COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD LEADERSHIP POSITIONS IN THE CORPORATION WHILE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE. THE APPOINTMENTS SHALL BE FOR TERMS OF ONE (1) YEAR.

B. THE MEMBERS OF THE AUDIT COMMITTEE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE IN-COMING PRESIDENT FOLLOWING THE ANNUAL MEETING BUT PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF HIS/HER ADMINISTRATIVE YEAR. AT LEAST

ONE MEMBER SHALL BE A PERSON WITH MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE IN ACCOUNTING OR AUDITING IN AN ACCOUNTING FIRM OR INDUSTRY.

C. THE DUTIES OF THE AUDIT COMMITTEE SHALL BE TO CONDUCT AN ANNUAL YEAR-END AUDIT OR FINANCIAL REVIEW OF THE FINANCES OF THE ORGANIZATION AS DIRECTED BY THE FINANCE COMMITTEE. THE AUDIT COMMITTEE SHALL PRESENT THE RESULTS OF THE AUDIT OR REVIEW, INCLUDING RECOMMENDATIONS AND COMMENTS, TO THE FINANCE COMMITTEE NO LATER THAN THE WINTER BOARD MEETING FOLLOWING ITS APPOINTMENT.

Current by-laws require a financial audit of the USJCI Senate finances each year that there is a change in treasurer and a financial review of the USJCI Senate finances each year that the treasurer continues in office by an outside auditing firm. The cost for a financial audit is about \$5,000 and the cost of a financial review is about \$3,000. Over the years, estimates have been solicited from other firms to conduct an audit/review for the organization and the cost has been consistently similar. This proposal is the result of consultation with CPAs who specialize in non-profit organizations, as well as finance professionals within the USJCI Senate membership. Both groups are in agreement that an annual audit/review by an outside auditing firm for an organization with the annual income/expenses of the USJCI Senate is not justified based on the cost. Those professionals advised that an internal audit/review committee whose members have solid finance experience would be sufficient to maintain the fiscal integrity of our organization.

ARTICLE XVI MEETINGS

Section 5 Quorums

A. A quorum at any meeting of the Corporation's Board of Directors shall require a presence of one-half (1/2) of the qualified members of the Board of Directors.

B. A quorum at any meeting of the Executive Meeting **COMMITTEE** shall require the presence of two-thirds (2/3) of the voting members of the Executive Committee.

C. No form of proxy shall be allowed in either Sub-Section A or B of this Section.

nonprofits and there are many similar characteristics. However, there are crucial differences between these two types of nonprofit organizations and it is important to understand the distinction. According to the Internal Revenue Service Code, 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4) organizations are nonprofit organizations that are exempt from paying federal income tax. 501(c)(3) organizations are either a public charity, private foundation or private operating foundation with open membership whereas 501(c)(4) organizations are civic leagues or associations operated exclusively for the promotion of social welfare. If you want the best of both worlds, you can have two separate but affiliated organizations - one a charitable 501(c)(3) and the other a 501(c)(4). In a nutshell, your 501(c)(3) would be your foundation and your 501(c)(4) would be your state Senate organization.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a safe, happy Holiday Season. Whatever your beliefs and celebrations, use this special time of year to spend time with friends and family. I look forward to seeing everyone in Melbourne! If I can be of any assistance, please do not hesitate to call!

Playing Santa Claus during the holiday season is truly an art form. But besides suiting up, there are many things to consider when taking on such an iconic role.

Just ask Jay Edmondson #41977.

Jay borrowed a Santa suit in 1998 to visit wife Patsy's kindergarten class. Today, Patsy FR #03 appears as "Mrs. Claus" alongside her husband throughout the holiday season. The retired OUC communications engineer has a thriving second career.

"Thirty years ago, I was one of many Jaycees who took underprivileged children on a Christmas shopping tour," he says. "The day included a luncheon, where Santa came in. At the end, I said to myself, 'Someday, I'm going to be Santa.'"

Jay stuck to his vow and today owns both summer and winter Santa costumes – some versions with fur trim cost more than \$1,000. But he doesn't need a wig, a beard or padding.

"Children are so used to seeing false beards so I'll say 'Pull on his beard' to convince them that he's the real deal," Patsy says, laughing. Her years of teaching allow her to soothe children who find Santa Clause intimidating, a scary stranger who brings tears instead of smiles.

"We met a 19-year old girl with cerebral palsy, who was very scared," Patsy recalls. "I introduced myself as Mrs. Claus and talked with her for a while. Finally, I asked if she would like to meet him. By the end of the night, she had her arms around Santa and gave him a big hug. Her parents cried as they watched."

Married for 26 years, the couple have five children and nine grandchildren. They met when Jay was 23rd State Senate President of the Florida JCI Senate. Patsy was invited to attend a meeting by one of his Vice Presidents, who was a close friend of hers. Patsy, a schoolteacher, was looking to meet some adults for socialization!

The Edmondson's start the holiday season appearances every year with the annual Jaycees Christmas Parade in Hollywood, Florida on the first Saturday in December. They also appear at nursing homes, elementary schools, Boy and Girl Scout troops, Camp Boggy Creek (a camp for children ages 7-16 who've been diagnosed with chronic or life-threatening conditions), churches, Wheely Fun Days, and private parties. Santa and Mrs. Claus only make appearances through December 25, and only in Florida.

The couple doesn't accept any fees for their appearances, preferring to send donations to Wheelchairs4Kids, an organization they dearly love. Jay knew Madeline Robinson, Executive Director of Wheelchairs4Kids, when they were Jaycees and the friendship continued in the Senate. Donations average \$100-\$150 per visit, however a visit with Santa and Mrs. Claus was recently auctioned off for \$600. Wheelchairs 4 Kids is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization dedicated to improving the lives of children with physical disabilities. Many children faced with living

with physical disabilities are in wheelchairs that are too small, in disrepair, or do not fit the needs of the child.

Answering probing questions from curious children also comes with the territory of playing Santa.

"We were at a fundraising event for Wheelchairs4Kids at the Clearwater Aquarium when a little boy with a mohawk haircut approached me and said, 'You're the real Santa, but there's an imposter downstairs,'" Jay says with a grin. "He took my hand and walked me to the window of a large tank, where a scuba diver was dressed in a Santa suit, feeding fish. I've converted a lot of kids. It's so rewarding."

Year after year, the Edmondsons remain delighted to see children's faces and hear their squeals of delight.

"Community involvement is important," says Jay, who was named a Jaycee Senator – the highest service award the organization bestows upon its members. "God just gave me this to do."

Jay has been playing Santa for five years and will continue to do it as long as he is able to. With his birthday on Christmas Eve, who else is a better fit to play Santa!

When not playing Santa and Mrs. Claus, Jay and Patsy are busy with Senate activities, AMVETS (both have a parent that was in the military), and active in their church where Jay assists with the Food Bank, and Patsy cooks every week for the Awana group. Patsy FR#3 currently serves the US JCI Senate as an assistant to First Lady Karol Pittman FR #50. Jay is the facilities chairman for the upcoming Region IV hosted US JCI Senate Winter Board of Directors Meeting in January 2020 in Melbourne, FL among many other responsibilities supporting President Lawrence.

Every year, he has been breaking and entering into the homes of children on Christmas Eve. He enters by any means possible, even through chimneys!


He leaves gifts for all of the good girls and boys but that does not discount his crimes. He steals copious amounts of cookies and gallons of milk! It is amazing that

A huge Shout Out to the Missouri JCI Senate and Region VI for hosting a great Fall Board of Directors meeting. Congratulations on a great meeting!

Your Constitution & Bylaws Committee met the day before the Fall Board of Director's Meeting in Kansas City. Committee members, Kay Elliot (Florida) #61747, Nancy Salopek (Pennsylvania) #47610, Tom Hendrix (Missouri) #37317, Carolyn Smith (Arizona) #64564 and our Advisor, Stu O'Hara (Ohio) #39768 were all present. We began this 2019-2020 People, Purpose, Passion year finishing up the work that began in our Reaching Out year on bylaw amendments relative to the future financial stability of our organization. We completed drafting amendments for \$2 dues increase to take affect in July 2020 and added the

option of an Audit Committee to our organization's financial management. 

I really appreciate the efforts of this year's team of Treasurers who did a good job in submitting their dues by the September 1st deadline. This sure makes it easier to prepare reports and finalize the money part with Treasurer Mike.

The US JCI Senate had 1,832 members due this quarter. There were a total of 78 members dropped and 80 new adds for a net change of +2. This is good considering 23 of our dropped members were the result of deceased members. Five regions grew for the quarter with Region 7 being the largest growth region at +6. A total of 18 states grew with Tennessee being the largest growth state at +6.

To view the second quarter results, they can be found on the US JCI Senate website. We had a total of 1,860 due for the quarter. Hopefully, we had another growth quarter to help the US Senate enjoy a year of growth.

Unfortunately, there are 18 known deceased members due in December. To avoid any unnecessary mailings or contacts with a deceased senator, please let your state organization or

myself know as soon as you learn of the death of a senator so their family does not receive unwanted publications. As states receive such information, make sure to let US JCI Senate Chaplain Bill Hossman now so they can be included in bi-monthly E-News and the year-end memorial service.

Another area that needs mentioning is that of addresses. With people moving all the time, it is important that your state has a current address for you. 



