THE BEGINNING OF OUR NATIONAL AND STATE ORGANIZATIONS

THE EVOLUTION OF OUR NATIONAL & STATE ORGANIZATIONS

In the US, the evolution of Senate groups cannot be known with certainty as to where, when or why the first Senate gathering came about. It is very probable that Senators gathered informally at their local state meetings. It may have

been in one of the large metropolitan areas or perhaps the result of efforts by Senators in a state Jaycee District or Region. Perhaps there were randomly scattered events in very informal settings. It may have occurred during an institute meeting that are held each year by the many Jaycees states. Once a state had several Senators, it was inevitable that they would try to gather together to share stories.

The first real large scale gathering of Senators may have actually been accomplished at a national Jaycee convention as a result of Jaycee efforts to bring together "oldtimers." Such an event may have resulted in the Senators upon their return home, recalling the fun and frolic which may have prompted them to consider a smaller scale version of the national meeting. They may have felt that they could have more Senators participate a little closer to home.

How, why, where or when that

first gathering was accomplished may always be a matter of speculation. It is more important that it happened. Perhaps it was in many places at the many times but from those early events would eventually grow the national Senate.

In the US, it was necessary for state Senate groups to develop first simply because it was consistent with the American way of growth. This is in part due to the large geography involved and the conditioning by the educational experience with institutions and government systems in existence.

The beginnings appear to have occurred in the early 1960's but could perhaps have begun even earlier. The growth of the state Senates eventually progressed to the point that at least 30 groups had developed. It was inevitable that a national meeting would be called to explore the idea of a national body.

As previously noted in this series

of articles, a national call to assemble was sent by Senator Leo Briere #9714, the Illinois Senate President in early 1972 to all known state contacts and by word of mouth as many Senators traveled. It was a slow and tedious process but each state grew over the years and now makes a tremendous impact in their areas.

In 50 years, the US JCI Senate has progressed tremendously under the leadership of 50 dedicated Presidents and many additional Officers and Appointees. Many programs have been started and funded as we have raised awareness on many fronts. The US JCI Senate Foundation has been started and continues to honor high school students with scholarships across the country. 51 state organizations serve their communities through countless projects and programs. Service to our Jaycee chapters is still our main focus.

His contributions were invaluable to us when we hosted US JCI Senate Fall Board Meeting, 2020. He has become an extremely outgoing and confident individual.




Florida's Fall Conference was the

The first quarter of our membership year is completed. I really appreciate the efforts of this year's team of Treasurers who did a good job in submitting their dues kits by the September 1st deadline. This sure makes it easier to prepare reports and finalize the money part with Treasurer Hal. This is always a challenge when the deadline is near Labor Day weekend and the Fall BOD Meeting is less than two weeks away.

The US JCI Senate had 1,851 members due this quarter. There were a total of 106 members dropped and 96 new adds for a net change of -10. This is good when you consider 44 of our dropped members were the result of deceased members.

Two regions grew for the quarter with Region VIII being the largest growth region at +13 followed by Region III at +9. A total of 13 states grew with Kansas being the largest growth state at +13 followed by Maine at +7 and Delaware, West Virginia and Illinois at +4. The other growth states were: MD, VA, FL, GA, IA, TX, ID, AZ. As the result of the September dues activities, the US JCI Senate membership is 8,004.

The December dues kits were sent out in early October. Due to the submission deadline for this issue of Mentors, I am unable to report the results even though they are known while you read this article. To view the second quarter results, they can be found on the US JCI Senate website. We have a total of 1,851 members due. With the Thanksgiving holiday just prior to the submission deadline of December 1st, I encourage state treasurers to submit their dues activity early. Remember, a copy of the Dues Submission Sheet and your checks are to be sent to Treasurer Hal Williams.

As a reminder to treasurers, make sure you send a copy of your dues kit submission to Assistant Membership Information Services Program Manager Dawna Norfleet at norfleet-dawna13@gmail.com. Dawna will be handling the dues billings and reports beginning with the March dues kits.

Unfortunately, the US JCI Senate continues to lose deceased members.

There are 19 known deceased members due in December. The number of deceased members being dropped seems to be increasing. A big reason for this increase is states not being made aware of a member passing away. I receive notices quite frequently from family members requesting to have the deceased Senator removed from the Mentors mailing list who has been gone for several years. To avoid any unnecessary mailings or contacts with a deceased Senator, please let your state organization or myself know as soon as you learn of the death of a Senator so their family does not receive unwanted publications. As states receive such information, make sure to let US Senate Chaplain Scott Kingsley know so they can be included in bi-monthly E-News and the year-end memorial service.

Another area of responsibility under my position is the Mentors mailing list. I have received 70 address changes from the post office as the result of the raffle ticket mailing. I have updated the mailing list and each state roster which will be reflected on the current state rosters when the dues kits are sent for December. Treasurers need to update their records with the changes.

There are currently over 300 duplicate addresses that receive Mentors. Most of these are husband and wife Senators. Each dues paying member is entitled to receive a copy

of the US JCI Senate magazine but if you only wish to receive 1 copy per household, please send an email to me at gpitt1@comcast.net.

Once again, if you are not or know of anyone not receiving their issue of Mentors, please contact your state membership chairman or treasurer to correct your address. You can also utilize the Change of Address form on the website or through the USPS.

For those that are interested, you can now receive Mentors electronically instead of the normal paper copy. If you wish to replace your paper copy with an electronic copy, go to the US JCI Senate website and complete the information on the link "Forms" and "Electronic Mentors" and submit it. Currently, we have 264 electronic subscriptions being sent out.

The Rocking Chair Test – The Island Way

How many of you have had or, if you're lucky, currently have a rocking chair in the house? It doesn't matter what kind of rocking chair. It could be soft cuddly La-Z-Boy with the arms and seat parts all faded from being loved. Or it could be a glider type of rocking chair purchased right before the arrival of your first child. Or maybe it's an heirloom wooden one that with some furniture polish and muscle it would shine like new.

For so many, the rocking chair is more than a piece of furniture; it is a symbol of relaxation, peace, and comfort. We gravitate toward our rocking chairs to collect our thoughts, claim our space, and sometimes we're able to enjoy rocking in synchronicity with another sitting on our laps. Its potential motion is like the ebb and flow of the ocean tide and this to me is the gift of the rocking chair – that it allows us to harness the energy of the body, combine it with the energy of the land, and become one in its rhythm.

It is in this connection and motion that there's one other gift the rocking chair can give us that many islanders understand. Please, allow me a moment to explain.

Imagine you're here in Hawaii, on one of the lovely islands pulled up out of the Pacific by the Hawaiian demi-God Maui. You're in one of our plantations-style homes with palm trees lining the driveway, and lau hala (Pandanus) fans rotating in the living room. A large woven lau hala mat serves as a carpet protecting the hardwood koa floors, and the scents of freshly brewed Kona coffee and baking taro bread wafts from the kitchen. Holiday music plays in the background, and the tropical breeze cools your skin as you sit, slowly rocking in the hand carved wooden chair on the porch. Your parents, spouse, kids, grandkids, and friends are milling around the house, in the distance. You realize you're at ease. Finally, relaxation has come.

Then, as you rock, you close your eyes and with each breath and each ebb and flow you gaze at yourself in that same chair but you have a keen awareness that you're looking at yourself, and it's the last day of your life. This is the rocking chair test. Keep your eyes closed and keep rocking.

Are you happy with what you've accomplished? What have you wanted to experience, try, say, do, risk, but didn't? Do you need to make amends? Are you holding onto ideas that don't serve you? Do you need to forgive someone - who? What do you need to let go of and to

make room for what? Is what you're holding onto truly necessary on this final day? Have you lived a good life? Is the happiness of those in your life important to you? Why or why not? Do the most important people know how much you care? If you're not making progress, what is the next step? Are you brave enough to say yes, or no?

As you think about these questions and the many others that will come with the rocking, you'll know you're on the right path when in your na'au (your gut) you feel centered and your pu'uwai (heart) feels calm. You'll know things are pono (in righteousness) with yourself because you're in flow with the motion, not against it. Otherwise, the gift is a knowing that you need to make a change and you still have time. Time to wake up, my friend. What are you waiting for?

Toby is survived by his three sons, six grandchildren, and four great grandchildren.




Jeffrey Sanders Finklea, #58330, Texas, He spent his adult life as a valued employee of Andrews Distributing for 28 years.
