

Ernie is a retired computer engineer and enjoys music, and working on computers.




We are also celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the US JCI Senate and that committee is planning on

Greetings from Constitution and By-Laws:

This is my final article for Mentors of my two-year term as Chair of the Committee. It has been a pleasure to work with both Presidents Ariel Jones #65423 and Mike Andrews #58412 during the two years. I would also like to thank the members of the committee during the last two years for their diligent work during this time.

At the Committee meeting in Melbourne, we did discuss that many questions may arise at the state level that are issues of your state Senate By-Laws and not of the US JCI Senate By-Laws. It is important to recognize that the By-Laws deal with the governance of the US JCI Senate and not of the various states.

A question about caucuses was raised by a Past President, but no change was deemed to be necessary

even though most regions elect at their spring meetings because at some point a region might not hold a spring election for some reason.

An additional obligation of the Chair of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee is to be an ex-officio member of the Future Directions Committee. This may be important if Future Directions wants to make proposals that require a change to the By-Laws. In attending the most recent Future Directions Committee meeting, a question arose as to whether an issue would require a change to the By-Laws or the Policy. After discussion, it was determined the questions they asked were related to Policy.

Recently, an issue has been brought to my attention that the Committee will be reviewing prior to our meeting in Louisville. In Louisville, we will decide whether to forward any proposed amendment to the Executive Committee for their consideration and then to be forwarded to the Board of Directors. If that is done, then that amendment will be voted upon in Golden, Colorado at the Fall Board of Directors Meeting.

Again, I would like to thank the members of the Committee for the past two years, Carolyn Smith #64564, Kay Elliott White #61747, Sam Young #37972, Rosaire Longe #28290, Bob MacDonald #58386, Allan Richardson #50550, and Alex "Hitman" Willis #34236. Can you believe our year together is nearly over with? How fast time flies! For my last Protocol Officer article, I'd like to remind everyone of the four "C's" of protocol are communication, common sense, courtesy and cash.

Communication: Written invitations should be sent well in advance of the event you wish them to attend and it should contain specific dates and pertinent details such as:

Attire—Guest should be informed of clothing needed for the function.

Action—If you expect your guest to speak, judge competition or perform other functions during the meeting, specific expectations should be given.

Host—Request that your guest notify you of their arrival time, method of travel, travel companion and special needs.

Common sense: It is considered common sense and proper protocol to recognize all past and present state and national officers in attendance

for your function. These individuals have earned the respect of their fellow Senators since each holds, or has held, a position of responsibility or has, through other contributions, given much to our organization. At business meetings visiting national officers should be given an opportunity on the agenda to address the group briefly.

Courtesy: The ranking officer of the host organization is the host for any invited guest to your function. The host should meet or designate someone to meet the visiting guest at the airport or other point of arrival. Please do not forget the guest's spouse. Consideration should be given to travel fatigue. Your guest may need to rest or freshen up before attending any meeting or social function and should be given that opportunity.

Cash: This is where the rubber meets the road. The host organization should provide all necessities during the visitation of invited guests: registration, lodging accommodations, local transportation, meals, etc. Host organizations should not hesitate to advise their guest of what can be provided and what cannot be provided. This should be addressed up front in the first phase of protocol, communication.

Keeping these 4 "C's" of protocol in mind will always help keep you out of any issues related to visitations from guests!

Since the last issue of Mentors, we have completed two more quarters of membership. As MIS Program Manager, I was responsible for handling the dues kits for December. Assistant MIS Program Manager Dawna Norfleet handled the March dues kits. Therefore, this report

is a combination of both efforts.

There were a total of 1,851 members due in December of which 98 were dropped and 111 new adds for a net growth of +13. This is extremely good when you consider 39 of our dropped members were the result of being deceased. Five regions grew for the quarter with Region IX being the largest at +16 followed by Region VIII at +10, Region I at +7, Region III at +4 and Region VI at +3. A total of 12 states grew with Oregon being the largest growth state at +16 followed by Maine and Kansas at +14 each. As the result of the December dues activities, the US JCI Senate membership is 8,017 which was +13 for the year.

For March, there were 1,834 members due. We dropped 78 and added 124 new members for a net growth of +46. This includes a total of 23 deceased members within the dropped members. This puts the US JCI Senate at +49 for the year.

A total of seven regions grew in March with Region VIII finishing at +16, followed by Region VI at +15, Region VII at +9, Region III at +7, Region V at +6, Region II at +4 and Region I at +1. There were a total of 21 states at growth: MA, NJ, NY, PA, DC, VA, WV, SC, IL, KY, MI, OH, IA, MN, MO, WI, TN, CO, KS, TX, AZ. The top growth states were Kansas at +12, Tennessee at +11 and Iowa at +6. This brings our current membership base to 8,063.

With one final quarter remaining this year, there are a total of six regions and 17 states at growth. June is our final and largest quarter of the year with 2,478 members due.

The membership results by state and region for each of the first three quarters can be viewed on the US JCI Senate website under Resources/Library, Reports and Forms Library and BOD Reports/Membership.

This year will complete my 9th year in this position. I want to

thank the state treasurers and state presidents for doing a great job in submitting dues kits and roster changes in order to keep our records updated.

Finally, I want to thank all of the US Senate Presidents and Treasurers for allowing me the opportunity to serve the US JCI Senate in this position.
