I am writing you concerning the matter of historical records preservation and more specifically the preservation of the records of the Alaska Jaycees. Two years ago the University of Alaska, Anchorage established an Archives and Manuscripts Department for the purpose of collecting, preserving and making available for research purposes records on the history and development of Alaska. We are in the process of attempting to identify individuals, families, social, political, and cultural and action groups, businesses and other organizations which have played a significant role in the growth and development of the state and area. It is our belief that the Alaska Jaycess are a group that has made a social and cultural impact on Alaskan Society.

We are therefore writing you to ask your organization to consider the deposit and preservation of its non-current records in the Archives and Manuscripts Department of the UAA Library. The records that we seek include minutes, administrative and subject correspondence files, project files, journals, financial records, legal records, copies of publications, photographs, and other similar materials. It is our intention to organize and preserve the records in a secure environment for use by historians and other research scholars. Reasonable restrictions on access may be negotiated on portions of any papers deposited in the UAA Library. The records would still be the property of your organization and we would provide records deposited in our care.

Too often records of a relatively recent era are not considered by many individuals and organizations to have his-

torical value. Because of this, useful and important records are often lost or destroyed. This is especially true of relatively recent records and of twentieth century records in general. In order to prevent this we are attempting to identify records of individuals, groups, and organizations, for preservation now or in the future.

- 1. The organization agrees to place its archival records on permanent deposit in the Library System, University of Alaska.
- 2. The organization agrees periodically to add additional materials to its archival records. This will be done every single years.
- 3. All records identified as restricted will be closed for research or any other use for a period of years mutually agreed upon by representatives of the organization and of the University of Alaska. This restriction shall be subject to such exceptions as may be provided by law.
- 4. The records of the organization will be maintained according to archival principles; any change in order or arrangement and any removals can be made only after consultation and agreement between representatives of the organization and the staff of the Library.
- 5. The Library System, University of Alaska, agrees to maintain the records under conditions which will provide for their security and preservation.
- 6. The staff of the Library System, University of Alaska, will prepare an inventory of the records of the organization deposited in the Library and will provide a copy to the offices of the organization.
- 7. The records of the organization will be open to responsible researchers and to representatives of the organization at regular public service hours of the Library System.
- 8. The organization may remove said records from the Library System, University of Alaska, if the above conditions are not met only after a) identifying to the University one or more of the conditions of deposit that have been violated and allowing the University 90 days to correct the situation; and b) on the University's failure to correct the situation within 90 days, declaring the depositor's intention to withdraw the records after an interval of at least one month.
- 9. The depositors may withdraw the records from the University for a reason other than that specified above any time after five years from the date of the agreement if 1) the depositors reimburse the University for the processing, maintenance and library overhead expenses incurred by the University in its custody of the records and 2) permit the University to; a) make copies of the materials, and to retain same; and b) to use and permit publication and use of same. The amount of the reimbursement will be negotiated at the time of the withdrawal.
